KCTCS Student Financial Responsibility Information

- When you register for class, you take on a financial obligation to pay tuition and charges by the term due date. If you do not pay your account by the established semester deadline, you may be subject to course cancellation.
- If you drop or withdraw from a class, you will be responsible for paying all or a portion of tuition
 and fees in accordance with the published tuition refund schedule. Failing to attend class does not
 absolve you of your financial responsibility as described above. For details, see our course catalog

- You are responsible for repaying to the college any funds that were returned on your behalf to the
 financial aid programs for which you may have lost eligibility. This can occur for a variety of
 reasons, particularly with regard to federal regulations regarding attendance, academic progress,
 falsifying FAFSA data, overpayment, withdrawal and more. Please visit <u>Tuition & Costs</u> for

- If you fail to pay your tuition bill and other charges by the scheduled due date, KCTCS will place a
 financial hold on your account, preventing you from registering for classes and requesting
 transcripts.
- A late payment charge of \$75 may be assessed when you don't pay your student account by the deadline.
- Delinquent accounts may be referred to the Kentucky Department of Revenue, which will assess
 additional collection fees on the account. Delinquent accounts may also be reported to one or
 more national credit bureaus.
